Cut

At 8-over-par 152, with an 11-for-6 playoff for the remaining match-play spots.

Weather

Rainy and windy with gusts to 25 mph on Monday with temperatures in the low 60s. Windy, with gusts to 20 mph, Tuesday with highs near 70 and scattered showers. Cooler, with temperatures near 60, and rainy Wednesday morning but clearing and warmer in the afternoon with highs near 70. Pleasant and partly sunny Thursday with temperatures near 80. Partly cloudy Friday morning with a few light scattered showers in the afternoon. High temperatures in the upper 70s with winds of 5-15 mph. Sunny and pleasant Saturday with a few clouds. Highs in the upper 70s with very light winds.

Notes

None of the nine mid-amateurs (age 25 and older) survived the cut for match play, which came at 8-over-par 152 ... Medalist Stephanie Kono defeated Emily Powers in the first round and avoided the mythical medalist jinx. The medalists the previous two years, 2007 and 2008, lost in the first round ... Jisoo Park of Korea,

just 14 years old, advanced to the semifinals ... Casie Cathrea, 13, was the youngest quarterfinalist in history. She was one month younger than Michelle Wie, who went all the way to the winner's circle in 2003. Cathrea lost to eventual champion Jennifer Song in the quarterfinals ... USGA officials made an interesting decision for the quarterfinals, moving up the tee on the par-5 18th hole some 40 yards, which gave the players the choice of going for the green in two shots. A water hazard guarding the right side of the green made the dilemma more interesting ... Song was born in Ann Arbor, Mich., and has dual citizenship in the U.S. and Korea ... Kimberly Kim, one of the finalists, won the 2006 U.S. Women's Amateur at the age of 14, the youngest champion in history. She also was a member of the victorious 2008 USA Curtis Cup Team ... Leigh Klasse, 49, of St. Anthony, Minn., won a USGA gold medal as a member of the Minnesota squad that won the 2001 Women's State Team Championship.
